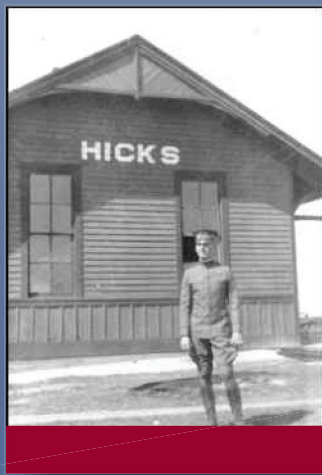


TALIAFERRO FIELD



Taliaferro (pronounced "Toliver") Field was one of three flying training fields built by the US Army around Fort Worth during World War I. The field was near the Hicks train depot north of Fort Worth and was also known as Hicks Field. The field was one square mile in size and was used by the Royal Flying Corps Canada and the US Army. On the west side of the property was the camp and 20 airplane hangars. A concrete ammunition storage building and a few foundations remain. The site was reused during World War II as a training field, but is now an industrial park.

TAKE AWAY: Taliaferro is pronounced Toliver. Taliaferro or Hicks Field was located north of Saginaw.
